History

In April 1967, the U.S. Air Force Special Air Warfare School was activated at Hurlburt Field under the Special Air Warfare Center, then located at Eglin AFB. In 1968, the school was re-designated the **U.S. Air Force Special Operations School.** On 1 June 1987, USAFSOS, as an organizational element of the 23rd Air Force, was assigned to the U.S. Special Operations Command, headquartered at MacDill AFB, Fla. As of May 22, 1990, the school became a reporting unit of the newly established Air Force Special Operations Command. During its formative years, the school's main thrust was the preparation of Air Force personnel for duty in Southeast Asia. Since then, the USAFSOS curriculum has grown from a single course of instruction with 300 graduates per year to 78 classes representing 28 formal courses a year and approximately 25 off-station tutorials.
